

KILRUSH TOWN COUNCIL
(PARKING PLACES) BYE-LAWS 2006

The **TOWN COUNCIL OF KILRUSH** (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 36 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994 (No. 7 of 1994) and all other enabling powers and, having consulted with the Commissioner of the Garda Síochána, hereby makes the following Bye-Laws :-

PART 1 – PRELIMINARY

1. These Bye-Laws shall be known as the Kilrush Town Council (Parking Places) Bye-Laws, 2006.
2. a. These Bye-Laws apply to public roads as specified in the schedules hereto within the functional area of Kilrush Town Council.

b. Streets or portions of streets in which parking is prohibited at any time are specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

c. Loading Bays/Bus Parking is specified in the Third Schedule hereto.
3. The Kilrush Town Council (Parking Places) Bye-Laws 2003 are hereby revoked in so far as they relate to the town of Kilrush.
4. In these Bye-Laws :

“**the Act of 1994**” means the Road Traffic Act, 1994 (No. 7 of 1994);

“**the Regulations of 1997**” means the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 182 of 1997);

“**the Signs Regulations of 1997**” means the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations 1997 (S.I. No. 181 of 1998);

“**disabled person’s parking bay**” has the meaning assigned to it in Article 4 of the Regulations of 1997;

“**disabled person’s parking permit**” means a permit issued under Article 43 of the Regulations of 1997;

“**disc parking place**” has the meaning assigned to it in Article 3 of the Signs Regulations of 1997;

“**vehicle**” means a private motor car, a station wagon or a passenger vehicle having accommodation for not more than seven passengers excluding the driver;

“**goods vehicles**” has the meaning assigned to it in Article 4 of the Regulations of 1997;

“**parking bay**” has the meaning assigned to it in Article 3 of the Signs Regulations of 1997 and identified by means of road markings as described in Article 18 of the said Regulations;

“**business hours**” means the period from 10.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on a day from Monday to Saturday inclusive which is not a holiday as described in the Fourth Schedule hereto;

“**holiday**” means Good Friday or any day that is a public holiday for the purpose of the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997 (No. 20 of 1997);

“**parking disc**” means a disc or document, or a combination of both, having marks or symbols capable of indicating the year, date and time when the disc, document or combination becomes a valid parking disc;

“**parking ticket**” means a ticket issued by the Council by means of a parking ticket machine which indicates the date of issue of the ticket, and the time at which it ceases to be valid;

“**parking ticket machine**” means a machine capable of automatically delivering a parking ticket when the fee prescribed by Bye-Law 12 of these Bye-Laws is inserted into the machine;

“**valid parking disc**” means a parking disc which –

- a) has been issued by Kilrush Town Council
- b) has been perforated or otherwise marked as appropriate to the particular type of parking disc so as to indicate clearly the year, month, day in the month, hour of the day and (to the nearest following five-minute period) minute of the hour of the commencement of a period of parking of the vehicle in which the parking disc is exhibited in accordance with these Bye-Laws
- c) indicates no other year, month, day, hour or minute, and,
- d) indicates that the vehicle is so parked for a period not exceeding the period for which it may be parked in a disc parking place in accordance with these Bye-Laws.

PART 11 – DISC PARKING

5. (1) Where a vehicle is parked in a disc parking place during business hours **Monday to Saturday inclusive** the following shall be displayed in accordance with the provisions set out in this Bye-Law :

(A) A “**valid parking disc**” in the following manner –

- (a) the valid parking disc shall be so exhibited in the interior of the vehicle that a person outside the vehicle can ascertain by reference to the perforations or markings when the parking commenced, and,
- (b) the valid parking disc shall be exhibited in accordance with paragraph (A)(a) of this Bye-Law for so long as the vehicle is parked in that disc parking place,
- (c) a valid parking disc shall be displayed for every two hour period or part thereof during which the vehicle is parked in a disc parking place.

OR

(B) A “**parking ticket**” in the following manner –

- (a) a parking ticket issued in respect of the vehicle shall be so exhibited in the interior of the vehicle that a person outside the vehicle can ascertain by reference to the parking ticket when the parking ticket ceases to be valid and the parking ticket shall be so exhibited for so long as the vehicle is parked in a disc parking place,
- (b) the parking ticket shall be exhibited in accordance with paragraph (B)(a) of this Bye-Law for so long as the vehicle is parked in a disc parking place,
- (c) where a parking ticket is exhibited on a vehicle other than a motor cycle parked in a disc parking place during business hours the vehicle shall not be so parked for longer than the period between the time the ticket is issued and the time it ceases to be valid.

6. A vehicle parked in a disc parking place during business hours shall not be so parked for longer than the period indicated as the maximum parking period for that disc parking place by means of an authorised information plate accompanying traffic sign number RUS 018 (Restricted Parking) authorised by the Signs Regulations of 1997.

7. Where a vehicle which had been lawfully parked in a disc parking place is subsequently lawfully parked in another disc parking place within the same street or road, the period to which the subsequent parking is restricted by Bye-

Law 6 of these Bye-Laws shall be reduced by a period equal to the period from the time indicated on the parking disc or parking ticket to the time when the subsequent parking commenced.

8. Where a vehicle is parked in a disc parking place during business hours a person shall not interfere with a parking disc or parking ticket exhibited in the vehicle.
9. A vehicle parked in a disc parking place at a time which is not during business hours shall be removed from the disc parking place when a period of business hours commences, unless at such commencement and during the remainder of the period of parking, a valid parking disc, parking ticket or parking permit is exhibited in the interior of the vehicle in accordance with Bye-Law 6 of these Bye-Laws.
10. A vehicle which had been parked in a disc parking place for the maximum parking period referred to in Bye-Law 6 of these Bye-Laws shall not be parked again in a disc parking place in the public road in which that disc parking place is situated until at least one hour after the vehicle last vacated that disc parking place.
11. The Council shall issue parking discs.
12.
 - (a) The fee for a parking disc shall be one euro (€) for two hours.
 - (b) A fee of one euro (€) shall be paid for a parking ticket for two hours.
13. A vehicle which is parked in a disc parking place during business hours shall, where parking bays are provided at that disc parking place, be parked within the area comprising a parking bay.
14. A person shall not park a vehicle in a Disabled Person's Parking Bay without having displayed thereon a Disabled Person's Parking Permit.
15. A mechanically propelled vehicle on which is displayed a Disabled Person's Parking Permit granted in respect of such vehicle, shall be exempt from the requirement to display a valid parking disc or parking ticket specified in Bye-Law 5 of these Bye-Laws.
16. Bye-Laws 5 to 14 of these Bye-Laws shall not apply to
 - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a public road, the provision, alteration or repair of a main drain, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, oil, water or electricity or of a telecommunications line or the provision of a traffic sign,

- (b) a fire brigade vehicle, an ambulance or a vehicle being used by a member of the Garda Siochana in the performance of the duties of that member.

PART 111 – PARKING PERMITS

17. In this part of these Bye-Laws:

“**owner**” means a resident by whom a vehicle is habitually kept and used;

“**resident**” means a person whose normal residence is at premises situated in a street containing a disc parking place;

“**parking permit**” means a document issued by the Council for the purposes of Bye-Laws 20 – 25 of these Bye-Laws and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law 19 of these Bye-Laws;

“**valid parking permit**” means a parking permit, which relates to a particular street or streets and to a period which, has not expired and which is issued by the Council.

“**visitor’s parking permit**” means a document issued by the Council for the purposes of Bye-Laws 20-25 of these Bye-Laws and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law 19 of these Bye-Laws.

“**business parking permit**” means a document issued by the Council for the purposes of Bye-Laws 20-25 of these Bye-Laws and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law 19 of these Bye-Laws.

“**health/emergency services parking permit**” means a document issued by the Council for the purposes of Bye-Laws 20-25 of these Bye-Laws and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law 19 of these Bye-Laws.

18. Bye-Laws 6 to 16 of these Bye-Laws shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in a disc parking place if there is displayed, in accordance with Bye-Law 21 of these Bye-Laws, in the vehicle when it is so parked, a valid resident’s parking permit which relates to the street in which that disc parking place is situated.

19. A parking permit shall contain the following particulars:

- (a) the name of the Council;
- (b) the make and registration number of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued,
- (c) the date of issue,
- (d) the street or streets to which it relates,
- (e) the period to which it relates, including the date of expiry,
- (f) the signature, and the designation, of the officer of the Council issuing it.

- (g) the vehicle licensing certificate number for the vehicle requiring the permit
 - (h) the name of the owner of the premises to which the permit relates
20. The display, in accordance with Bye-Law 19 of these Bye-Laws of a valid parking permit on the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued, shall permit the owner of the vehicle (or any person using it with his/her consent) to park it without limitation as to time in a disc parking place in a street to which the permit relates.
- A valid health/emergency services parking permit shall permit the owner of the vehicle (or any person using with his/her consent) to park it in any disc parking place without limitation as to time in the legitimate pursuance of their health/emergency duties.
21. A valid parking permit shall be so displayed in the interior of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued and it can be read from outside the vehicle.
22. Where a vehicle displaying a parking permit is parked in a disc-parking place a person shall not interfere with the permit.
23. (1) A parking permit shall be issued by the Council in respect of the parking of a vehicle in a disc-parking place in the functional area of the Council.
- (2) An administrative charge for the processing of permit applications shall be set annually in a schedule of charges to apply.
- (3) A parking permit shall be issued by the Council in respect of the vehicle of which the resident is the owner and shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of implementation, **with the exception of a visitor parking permit which is valid for 7 days from the date of issue** in respect of that vehicle and for the street or streets to which the permit relates.
- (4) The Council shall issue one parking permit per domestic unit.
24. Where, during the period to which a resident's parking permit relates, the resident to whom it is issued ceases to reside at the address specified on the permit or ceases to be an owner by disposing of the vehicle to which the permit relates, he/she shall return it to the Town Clerk, Kilrush Town Council. A refund of the fee or any part thereof shall not be made.
25. Where, during the period to which a resident's parking permit relates, the resident to whom it is issued disposes of the vehicle to which the permit relates and substitutes another vehicle for the one disposed of, he/she shall return the permit to the Town Clerk, Kilrush Town Council who, upon payment of the fee as specified annually in a schedule of charges by the resident, shall either insert the make and registration number of the substituted

vehicle on the permit or issue to the resident a new permit in respect of that vehicle, and such new permit shall be valid for the period specified.

26. A person who contravenes these Bye-Laws shall be guilty of an offence in accordance with Section 36(8) of the Road Traffic Act 1994.
